From Palestine to Florence

Silvia Reich was born in 1914 in Leopoli, a city that was annexed to Poland in 1919 and eventually annexed to the Soviet Ukraine in 1945. Her parents, Leon, a lawyer, and Regina Gerstman emigrated to Palestine₁. Silvia graduated from Herzliya High School in Jaffa in the literature curriculum. In 1936-37 she enrolled in the Agriculture Department at the University of Florence. She took her final exam on 24 February 1940; then she requested a certificate which confirmed the exams she had taken (the confirmation was released in May). She subsequently withdrew "due to *force majeure*" all her documentation₂. With the imminent onset of war, Silvia decided to return to Palestine.

Graduation after the war

After the war was over, in September 1946, Silvia applied for readmission to the university as a *fuori corso* student (one who does not pass all the exams on time). After taking exams in seven subjects, she graduated in Agricultural Sciences on 17 July 1947 with a thesis entitled «Influenza fra soggetto e nesto negli innesti delle piante da frutta» (Influence between subject and nesto on grafts of fruit plants). She got the maximum grade of 110/110 and the *dignità di*

stampa (recommendation her thesis be published)³. No further information has been found on the subsequent phase of her life.
